

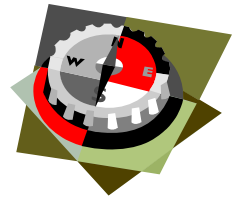

Ask the Experts



QUESTION

"Must my transit provider transport my wheelchair or scooter?"

Answer:

Public transit providers must transport wheelchairs or scooter up to a maximum of 30 inches wide by 48 inches long in size and up 600 pounds in weight when occupied. Service may be refused to those using larger or heavier wheelchairs for the safety of both passenger and personnel. These size and weight limits must be considered when a wheelchair or scooter is being acquired to assure continued use of transport services.
